

MAKING QUILT LABELS WITH WORD

FABRIC TO COPY ON

You can purchase copy ready fabric at stores or on line. It works fine, but the material seems stiff and coarse. You can make fabric sheets for your printer. Use a finely woven, smooth cotton, a 200 count all cotton sheet works well. Cut it into 9 x 12" rectangles. Soak it in Bubble Jet Set 2000 liquid to prepare it to accept ink. Squeeze dry and iron very smooth. Pour extra liquid back in bottle to reuse. Lay this piece of fabric on one of two things – freezer paper and iron or Avery full size label paper. Make sure you have this very smooth and no bubbles. You can reuse both of these products with your next sheet of fabric. Use rotary cutter and trim to 8 ½" x 11".

MICROSOFT WORD TO CREATE LABEL

Directions- Bold print will tell you where to find to the different steps that are needed. Print will explain what to do.

Home- Click on no spacing.

Home/Insert -Click on table Click on add a table. Make dimensions 1x1,

Left Click inside the table box. Select Table properties with a click. Select a row height and column width. 3" x 3" is usually good. Next select the fill cup. There are many shades. Select something that will blend with your quilt backing.

Return to Home- Click inside the tinted column box and type. I like to do a return first to move my printing down from the top

My Quilt Why it was made and to whom Quilter by ____ Pattern Made by Date Town Material/ batting Care instructions
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Most the time I will use the above information.

You can change size and font to whatever you like.

PRINTING

Use a bubble jet printer, a laser printer is too hot.

Check the paper load in your printer and determine which side it will eventually print. I place an X on one side with a pencil to determine this and test. After this is determined, place your piece of fabric in the paper box. Send and print. Give to fabric a few minutes to dry. Peel the paper off the back. Iron with a dry iron to set the ink.

Most labels are not paper size, so I will make several at one time for the various projects that are started and save them. I can print more than one on a page. Then they are ready when the project is done.
